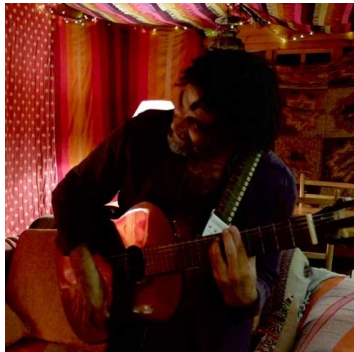

**Batik****New Knowledge:**

- Batik is a method of dyeing fabric where some areas are covered with wax or pastes made of glues or starches to make designs.
- The word batik originates from the Javanese tik and means to dot.
- A batik effect can be used with a tool like you would a pen.
- A resist, like wax, is used to create a barrier between the ink and the material, depending on the material used.
- When applying the resist, you must create a thin continuous line. If you don't the dye may bleed through the resist.
