New Knowledge:

- Shading is used to show light and shadow.
- Different pencils can be used to create soft and hard lines, tone and texture.
- Perspective drawing is a technique to create linear illustration of depth.
- Proportion refers to the relationship between one shape or form when compared to another shape or form. This includes height, width, depth.
- Colour relationships are described as complimentary colours, harmonious colours.
- Paintbrushes can be controlled for a variety of purposes to create texture, lines and finer details.
- Watercolour paint can be used to create washes for backgrounds then add detail.
- Darker and lighter colours can be added to create tints and shades instead of black and white.
- Colour choice can convey mood and create atmosphere.
- Collage techniques are coiling, overlapping and mosaic.
- Paintings/collage can convey feelings and expression.
