**New Knowledge:**

- People are special in different ways. We are all special, because we are all different.
- Jesus wanted everyone to know that they are loved by God, and they matter to him, because God cares for everyone. Christians believe that people are special because everybody is important to God.
- Belonging means to be part of a particular group. Christians belong to the religion called Christianity.
- People can belong to groups that have non-religious world views such as Humanism\*\*.

- The church is a building where Christians sing and Church Christians sing, pray and worship. Belonging to the church makes Christians feel as though they are part of a special community; it also makes them feel closer to God.
- Many churches are built in the shape of a cross.
- Christians use or wear symbols to show that they belong to Christianity and the church e.g cross, fish, dove or candle. The cross is a symbol of Christianity because Jesus died on a cross. Christian symbols also help Christians to remember important aspects of Christianity.
- To baptise someone means to become a member of the Christian church. The symbolism of the cross that is made on a baby's head in the context of welcoming a child into the family of God in the church.
