New Knowledge:

- Christians describe God as a creator
- God is all knowing, all seeing, all loving and all around.
- Christians believe that there is only one God, but that this one God consists of 3 "persons"; God the Father, God the Son, The Holy Spirit.
- Christians believe in the Holy Trinity – the father, the son and the holy spirit. They are reminded of this through different. Symbols are used to portray God as 'Three in One' e.g. three linked circles or rings. This is known as the Holy Trinity.
- Faith can impact the moral decisions that Christians make.
- The story of Abraham is also important to Jews and Muslims
- Abraham's faith in God was tested with his promise to see if he would take God for his word.
