New Knowledge:

- Britain is a democratic society.
- There is a difference between dictatorship and democracy.

- Laws can be local or national e.g. inner city pollution.
- People can influence laws around issues – protests, strikes, petitions, writing to MPs, joining campaign group or charities.

- Local councils provide services such as schools/education, housing, health, welfare payments, transport, environment (e.g. green bin charges).
